

*April 6, 2021*

**The Historic Preservation Commission of the Town of Corydon, Indiana met in the Town Hall, 219 N. Capitol Avenue, Corydon, Indiana, on the 6<sup>th</sup> of April 2021.**

The meeting was called to order by Adam Burkhardt at 6:01 PM.

Everyone stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Janet Bischoff made a motion to approve the March 2, 2021 Meeting Minutes. Tim Johnson seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0. Janet Bischoff made a motion to approve the March 16, 2021 Meeting Minutes. Tim Johnson seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0

Brian Bates spoke to the Commission regarding an iron fence he was constructing around his home on Cedar Glade Avenue. He apologized to the Commission for not coming sooner as he had not realized a gate would be included in the items to bring in front of the Historic Preservation Commission. Brian gave the Commission pictures of the fence and gate and the chimney-type structures they wanted to mount the gate onto. Brian described that they would be using the same color on the new chimney-type structures as the current chimneys on the building. Brian said they are also considering lights in the ground. Laura Renwick recommended approval. **(\*see attached staff comments)** Adam Burkhardt mentioned that the home was listed as Outstanding in the Historic Registry and is one of the oldest homes in Indiana. Tim Johnson made a motion to approve the fence and gate with the chimneys. Janet Bischoff seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0 to approve the changes.

Janet spoke to the Commission regarding the residence located at 511 E. Chestnut St. She had received word that someone was working on the house and wanted to make sure they had gone through the Commission. Adam moved that Susan check on the residence and see if they had obtained permission

for the work. If they had not the motion was to have Susan help the owners apply for what was needed. Janet seconded the motion and the motion passed 3-0.

Laura Renwick let the Commission know that the National Conference for Historic Preservation would be July 13-17 in 2022. The Statewide conference would be held virtually from September 30- October 1.

Janet made a motion to adjourn. Tim seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0. The meeting was adjourned at 6:24 PM
